#### Sequim Community Orchestra

Sequim Community Orchestra begins its third season as a full-fledged tax exempt 501(c)3 corporation. Thanks to all the community support for our concerts and for the very successful launch of SCO's first-year strings class in Sequim Schools. We had great support from the school district and board and particularly superintendent Kelly Shea, principals Donna Hudson and Russ Lodge and music teacher Stephanie Clark, and, of course, parents and students.

SCO Strings "graduated" a first-year class of 17 students, most of whom wish to continue for the second year. The plan is to keep the program growing by adding a new beginning class this fall. This means hiring a second teacher. We are hoping for local support, as our

spring grant submission was put on hold until we heard from the IRS.

SCO's vision is to make the class available to all students who wish to participate; therefore, no fees are charged. For students unable to rent an instrument, several local residents have donated unused instruments of varying sizes. Our other program, the orchestra, will begin rehearsals mid-September. Sequim Community Orchestra is a real community orchestra open to anyone, any age, who can read music, has an instrument and wants to share in the enjoyment of making music. Our orchestra is partially member supported; however no one is refused admission. Dues are supplemented by generous donations from attendees at our two concerts.
